

Our wonderful third graders are continuing to learn lots of great things! In Math, we've started our second i-Ready unit: Multiplication and Division. We began by learning the meaning of multiplication and progressed to multiplying by the factors 0-10. From there we will learn the meaning of division, and how multiplication and division are connected. In ELA, we are wrapping up learning about the importance of reading and books around the world. In science we have been learning about weather and why it's important to observe and record it. We'll be using the knowledge we acquired to design, create and test the roofs for our model houses that will be able to withstand a rain storm. With the election coming up, we'll learn about the office of the president and how people are elected. And of course, we'll be talking about this month's life skill of responsibility. We're working on becoming responsible citizens of Willow Avenue who follow school rules and complete our assignments. How can your child practice responsibility at home?

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Fabulous Fourth Grade with Mrs. Cleeves & Ms. Merante

Fourth Graders had a fa-boo-lous October. We can't believe it is already November! This month, both classrooms are finishing up our first science unit. Students are having a blast learning about volcanoes and earthquakes. We have learned how these events affect humans and how we can protect ourselves from earthquakes. Students acted as engineers to follow criteria and constraints to build an earthquake resistant building to test on a shake table. In math, multiplication facts are being reviewed and students have mastered multiplying one digit numbers by numbers up to the thousands. Students learned and mastered a variety of different strategies to multiply and are now ready to build upon these strategies and multiply two digit numbers. Both classrooms are continuing to use their Writer's Notebooks and are building upon their knowledge of Narrative Writing. Students are starting to learn to write using multiple paragraphs in their stories and learning more about the editing process in writing. We are continuing to learn about New York State, and how hunters started to move to North America and found New York State. These hunters had to adapt to a new environment here and learned how to farm to get their food. There is so much to be thankful for!

of sleep!


We are in full Fall mode here in the art room! Kindergarteners practiced their tracing and cutting skills by making a Jack O'Lantern. We talked about the different shapes we could use for the face. We will be moving on to a printmaking project next, using lego blocks to print designs. First graders are learning about the Aztecs from Mexico and are making paper collage suns. Some works from our first grade classes will be selected to be put on display at the High School for Multi Cultural Night on November 14th. Our second graders are brushing up on their warm and cool colors, creating a work of art using found leaves. Third graders are beginning a zentangle project. A zentangle is an abstract, meditative style of drawing using patterns that are repeated to create an image. Students will be drawing their patterns in a leaf shape and will be painting them using either warm or cool colors. Our fourth graders are finishing up their Fall coffee filter drawings and are gearing up for a Winter project next! Stay tuned for more exciting creations from our art studio!
