1st Grade – Mrs. Berchielli & Mrs. Line - First graders have settled into our daily routines and are really picking up steam with academics! Students are thriving in reading groups, improving fluency, decoding, and comprehension. At Black Rock Forest, students had fun hiking and completing a nature scavenger hunt! Both first grade classes enjoyed hosting veterans as special visitors. Students asked the veterans questions and thanked the veterans for their service. Of course, they enjoyed capping off this event with treats! We also spent time focusing on all the wonderful things we have to be grateful for!

**2nd Grade** – Mrs. Byrne & Mrs. Santos Sensational second grade has been working very hard. We now have a deep understanding of place value and can represent numbers in multiple ways. We finished our first science unit, the properties of matter. We have done many experiments and hands- on activities to sort, classify and name objects as solid, liquids, and gasses. Second graders also learned about the election process. We hosted a school wide election and Pajama day won! We are now learning about the different types of communities. Did you know that we live in a suburban community? Ask us about it!

#### Willow Avenue – Academics (cont'd)

<u>3rd Grade</u> – Mrs. Hogan & Miss Mante – Our inquisitive third graders will be going on a field trip to Locust Grove on December 13th. They will participate in inquiries to study forces and motion by measuring distance and force. On the property is Samual Morse's summer home and the students will also do a house hunt using clues to find artifacts from long ago. They will visit the barn and walk the grounds to see how simple machines can help you work more efficiently. The third graders blew us away as they learned about weather in science. They learned all about weather and climate patterns around the world, and they applied that knowledge to determine the best place to build a structure to host a sporting event. In ELA, we will begin our new unit and will explore pourquoi tales, which explain "why". Afterwards, we will use Book Creator to create books and publish our tales. In Math, we've marched into learning our multiplication facts with the goal of mastering many of them before winter break. So practice those facts on the bus, in the car, and at the dinner table! They are a foundational skill that makes doing math so much easier. The third/fourth grade floor is looking forward to the 3rd annual Winter Wonderland Celebration before our holiday break.

4th Grade – Mrs. Cleeves & Ms. Merante – Sleigh Bells ring, who is listening???? So much excitement in grade 4 as we gear up for the month of December and all it has to offer. The students have recently started a new classroom book that connects to our social studies curriculum. The book is titled The Sign of the Beaver by Elizabeth George Speare. Students continue to work in small reading groups where they can practice the skills that are taught through the whole class books. The native will be the main focus of our social studies unit. They will gain an understanding of how these natives lived in New York. We have also wrapped up our multiplication unit and have moved onto division where they are excited to finally learn long division! Our next science unit will be How Motion Energy Changes in a Collision. Students will be learning how motion energy moves and changes, how speed affects motion energy, what causes moving energy to slow down and finally, they will design bicycle helmets that will teach them the importance of protecting their skulls in a collision. 

Artful News from Mrs. Butler - Wow, our school year is flying by! It is hard to believe in just a few short weeks we will be saying goodbye to 2023 and welcoming in a new year! Our artists have been busy this last month-Kindergarten artists learned about Primary and Secondary colors and learned how to create secondary colors by combining two primary colors together. We learned that the primary colors red and yellow make orange, blue and yellow make green, and red and blue make purple. We used all of our beautiful painted papers to create collaged turkeys! Our first grade artists learned a technique using oil pastels to give artwork a tie-dye effect using an eraser to rub through the oil pastels. Second graders finished their complementary color monsters and also created zentangle hand turkeys. Zentangle artwork is work that has different patterns throughoutwe made the feathers of our turkeys zentangles. Third graders learned about Pop artist Wayne Thiebaud and have been learning how to draw three dimensional slices of pie. We learned how to shade to make our slices look realistic. We will be completing our pie slices with watercolor colored pencils! Fourth graders learned about Austrian artist Gustav Klimt, specifically studying his "Tree of Life" painting. We are creating plaster sculptures of trees in his style. We also discussed the importance of reusing materials, and used empty alue sticks and cut-up cardboard boxes as the armature for our trees.
