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Expectations and Grading Policy for Regents Chemistry

- I. Materials: A class notebook for in class notes and assignments and a composition notebook for study guides are required for class each day. Most questions given on assessments will come from class notes or activities. Students must bring with them a scientific calculator and NYS Chemistry Reference Tables to class daily.
- II. Technology: All students will be required to use the following freely available programs/websites for participating in class:
 - Google Classroom (submission and notification of assignments, remote)
 - Kami (editing pictures/pdf documents)
 - Google Forms (quizzes, assessments, surveys)
- III. In-Class: Activities and quizzes assigned in class will be graded on a case by case basis. Activities will be graded based on completion and participation, whereas quizzes will be graded on correctness and work where appropriate, and will cover previous work.
- IV. Assignments: Remote lessons will usually consist of an asynchronous activity, followed by a short assignment. Notes for the lesson and the completed short assignment **must be submitted by 11:59 PM that day** credit.

Remember to write your name. Inappropriate content of any kind posted online will result in disciplinary action.

- V. Laboratory Requirement: The New York State Board of Regents states that only students who complete 1200 minutes of laboratory component may take the Regents Exam. This must include a lab report, submitted by the following Friday after the last D-day lab class. Late labs are subject to a penalty. Labs will be collected and stored according to NYS lab requirements.
